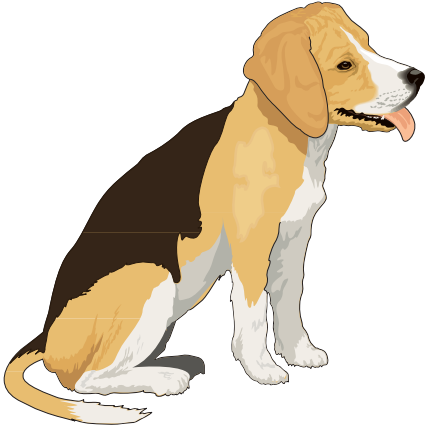


## IMPORTANT GUIDELINES



1. Make an appointment to have your pet examined by your veterinarian and do not forget to pickup your pets records.
2. Ask your veterinarian to recommend a vet located in the new area you are relocating to.
3. If you are relocating overseas, your pet will need to be examined and vaccinated 30 days prior to your move.
4. Secure a form of identification to your pets collar.
5. When booking a hotel, motel or corporate housing, make sure to consult the management as to their policies on pets.
6. Before crossing into some states, know that some states have a border inspection of all animals.
7. If moving overseas, be mindful that many countries require animals to be quarantined for a certain length of time.
8. Limit your feeding of your pets to once a day, preferably in the evening, unless your veterinarian instructs otherwise.
9. The appropriate sized kennel should allow your pet room to stand up, lie down, and turn around in natural positions.
10. If you are moving locally, take your pet on several visits to the new home before you move in, this will familiarize them with their new habitat.
